This year we return to the Oak Tree Inn at Balmaha, which will host the start, finish and the Concours d'Elegance. We were delighted with the warm welcome we received from Sandy Fraser and all at the Oak Tree last year, and we look forward to their hospitality amid the spectacular setting.

For the second year we welcome our sponsor Bob Hay, and hope that he will enjoy his day with us. Since last year's event he has formed and invested in a new company – THE HAY PARTNERSHIP - to supersede Hay Lough Davis, He continues to offer the same Architectural and Town Planning services for businesses and private individuals located in and around Loch Lomond and the Trossachs, Stirling, etc. So far the new company is proving to be very busy, working successfully with previous and new clients.

There will again be a "wee" route of around 58 miles suitable for cars in the Veteran class and any others whose drivers prefer it, and a "big" route of around 75 miles for everybody else. For the first time, there will be an 'open' class for cars built after 1982 which are considered to be of particular interest. The event will again feature light-hearted "examinations" leading to the award of degrees by the Automotive University of Rhu (Balmaha Campus).

REGULATIONS

- 1. RSAC Motorsport Limited (the Organisers) will promote a Touring Assembly The Hay Partnership RSAC Three Lochs Classic on Sunday 20 August 2017 under a Certificate of Exemption number 102883 issued by the Motor Sports Association.
- 2. The event is open to all motor cars manufactured before 1982, and to cars manufactured after that date if deemed by the Organisers to be of particular historic interest. Competing cars will be divided into the following classes:

- 3. The event will start from the Oak Tree Inn, Balmaha at 10.00 a.m. on Sunday 20 August 2017. The finish of the run will take place at the Oak Tree Inn where the first car is expected to arrive at approximately 12.30 p.m.
- 4. A Concours d'Elegance will be held in conjunction with the run. This will take place at the Oak Tree Inn, Balmaha where judging will begin at approximately 2.00 p.m. on Sunday 20 August. The presentation of awards will take place at approximately 4.30 p.m. on Sunday 20 August.
- 5. The total distance of the run will be approximately 58 miles for Veteran cars and 75 miles for Vintage, Classic and other cars.
- 6. The run takes the form of a dignified presentation of vehicles. Cars may only carry the number of passengers permitted by the seating accommodation. Entrants and drivers must agree to maintain the proper numerical order when required to do so.
- 7. Cars will be required to carry one official number plate supplied by the Organisers during the event. This plate will incorporate publicity for the Organisers of the event. Advertisements or trade signs, other than manufacturer's standard emblems, must not be carried or displayed on any car during the event.
- 8. Cars and drivers may receive outside assistance during the run. However, cars may not be towed or conveyed on a float or other vehicle after the start.
- 9. The Organisers will not be responsible for damage to, or loss of, any car, its parts or accessories, or for any damage caused by any entrant or car, and any entrant by entering and driving, and a passenger by taking part, shall thereby waive any right of action at law against the Organisers for any damage sustained by him (her or them) in consequence of any act or omission on any part of the Organisers, or of the officials, representatives or agents with respect to these regulations or to the run or to any matter arising therefrom.
- 10. The maximum number of entries to be accepted is 100. The Organisers reserve the right to limit the number of entries in any class, or to refuse any entry without giving a reason. They also reserve the right to abandon or postpone the run or any part thereof, if any circumstances arise which, in the opinion of the Board, render such a course desirable.
- 11. There will be no entry fee.
