Clyde Valley Rally 29 September 2019

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

The Clyde Valley Rally on Sunday 29 September will cover a new route over the border country of Scotland, with a visit arranged to a special location of interest on route. The pace of the event is ideal for those wishing to try a motor sport event for the first time. Starting at the New Lanark World Heritage Village, the tour will cover some 140 miles over scenic and interesting roads across the Scottish borders to finish around the Blyth Bridge area for a buffet tea and presentations.

1. Announcement:

The Clyde Valley Rally will be held on Sunday 29 September 2019 and is organised by the CCHMSC Ltd. The event will start the New Lanark World Heritage Village, Lanark, ML11 9DB and finish near Blyth Bridge. The Start and finish location will be issued with the final instructions.

2. Jurisdiction:

The event will be held under the general rules of the Motorsport UK as a Touring Assembly and these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event. A Motorsport UK permit has been applied for.

3. Eligibility:

The event is open to all members of the Caledonian Classic and Historic Motor Sport Club Ltd. Membership may be added to the entry form if required (£5 per person)

4. Vehicles:

The event is open to the following:

- a) Cars manufactured before 1980.
- b) Sporting and saloon cars of any age.
- d) Other cars permitted at the discretion of the organisers.

Cars constructed before 1980 will be given preference for entry.

5. Entry List:

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and entry form.

The entry list closes on 24 September 2019.

Refunds for withdrawn entries will be at the discretion of the organisers.

6. Scrutineering

Pre-event document inspection and signing on will take place from 10.00am at the start location. The first car will depart at 10.45am and you will be given your start time in the final instructions.

Entrants will be required to sign a declaration to say that they have the following

- A valid MOT certificate.
- A valid Road Fund Licence
- A minimum of Third Party Insurance for all persons who will drive the participating vehicles must be applicable for the duration of the event.

Cars must comply with the Motorsport UK regulations for the event.

8. Route, Navigation and Driving Behaviour:

The route will be on public A and B class and unclassified roads all on sealed surfaces. The route instructions will be in the form of Tulip Diagrams, supplied after inspection of documentation and signing on, prior to the start.

Participants must always comply with the requirements of the Road Traffic Acts and drive in a responsible and considerate manner. Please remember other road users, cyclists, walkers and livestock.

10. Entries:

The entry fee is £10. This includes a rally plate, and the roadbook. To keep the entry price to a minimum all refreshments at the start, on route and at the end are at the crew's own expense. All entries must be made on the entry form and accompanied by the appropriate fee. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt. Email entries will be accepted. (Scan or photograph your entry form and email to the entry secretary.) All entries must be on the official entry form. Posted entries should have the appropriate fee enclosed, or direct Bank Transfer. Email entries may pay at Signing On, or by direct Bank Transfer.
