Dave's Dales, Moors and Forest 17th and 18th September 2022

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

Dave's Dales, Moors and Forest is a 2-day tour which will, be wholly in England (apart from the start). We head southeast, crossing the border, heading to Weardale and through the North Pennines AONB (Area of Natural Beauty). Reaching Scotch Corner we continue east into the Cleveland Hills, and the North York Moors National Park. We will climb the Rosedale Chimney Bank, a hill that shares the title of steepest road in England (the other Hardknott Pass in Cumbria). An opportunity to visit Mathewson's Garage and Museum with a collection of classic and vintage vehicles is on our route. We cross Sutton Bank hill, offering superb views across the Vale of York. The steep descent leads to Sutton-under-Whitestonecliffe, the longest hyphenated place name in England (27 letters). Turning southwest we pass Thirsk, and Knaresborough to reach Harrogate, our overnight stop.

Regrouping on the Sunday morning we leave Harrogate, heading into the Yorkshire Dales National Park. We pass through Ribblesdale and the Ribblehead viaduct on the Settle to Carlisle railway line. Pressing northwest we head for Kirkby Stephen, through Buttertubs Pass. On the home stretch we continue northwest heading for our final destination a Penrith.

A good mixture of flowing fast roads and some narrower twisty sections. Lunch halt locations on both days will be of your choosing, there being many interesting pubs, hotels and cafés en route. Tea and coffee will be available to buy at the start location in Gretna and a meal is included at the finish venue in Penrith. The Tour will be approximately 310 miles total.

1. Announcement:

Dave's Dales, Moors and Forest tour will take place on 17th and 18th September 2022 and is organised by the CCHMSC Ltd. The event will start at Gretna Outlet Village, Dumfries and Galloway DG16 5GG, map ref. NY 324673 on 17th and finish at the Penrith Golf Club, Salkeld Rd, Penrith, CA11 8SG on 18th September for presentation of awards and meal. The overnight halt will be in Harrogate, Yorkshire, where the event will restart Sunday 18th.Directions to the Start location will be issued with the Final Instructions.

2. Jurisdiction:

The event will be held under the general rules of Motorsport UK as a Touring Assembly and these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event. A Motorsport UK Certificate of Exemption for a Touring Assembly has been applied for.

3. Eligibility:

The event is open to all members of the Caledonian Classic and Historic Motor Sport Club Ltd. Non-members may take part for the additional joining fee of £5 per head. This provides membership for the remainder of 2019.

4. Vehicles:

The event is open to the following:

- Cars manufactured before 1980.
- Sporting cars of any age.
- Other cars permitted at the discretion of the organisers.
 Cars constructed before 1980 will be given preference for entry.

5. Entry List:

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and entry form. The entry list closes on Saturday 10th September 2022.

Refunds for withdrawn entries will be at the discretion of the organisers.

6. Documentation:

Pre event document inspection and signing on will take place from 9.00am at the start venue. The event will start at 10.00am.

7. Scrutineering

Entrants will be required to sign a declaration to say that they have the following

- A valid MOT certificate (where applicable).
- Valid Road Tax
- A minimum of Third Party Insurance for all persons who will drive the participating vehicles must be applicable for the duration of the event.

Cars must comply with Motorsport UK regulations for the event.

8. Route, Navigation and Driving Behaviour

The route will be on public A and B class and unclassified roads and will all be on sealed surfaces. The route will be supplied after inspection of documentation and signing on, prior to the start. It will take the form of marked maps in road book format.

Participants must at all times comply with the requirements of the Road Traffic Acts and drive in a responsible and considerate manner. Please remember other road users, cyclists, walkers and livestock.

9. Entries

The entry fee is £80 per crew of 2 for CCHMSC members. In addition there will be a joining fee of £5 per head for non-members. Additional crew members may partake at £15 per head. Entry includes a road book, rally plate, meal at the finish and a finishers' award. All other meals and accommodation are NOT included. All entries must be made on the entry form and accompanied by the appropriate fee. Maximum number of entries is 40. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt. **Email entries will be accepted with payment by BACS. Club's bank details are on the entry form.**

Breakfast may be purchased at the start from 9.00am if required.
