SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

The CCHMSC Grass Gymkhana is a fun and social event taking place at Craiglaw Farm Rumbling Bridge, Kinross. The event will consist of a series of fun games and tests on a grass surface, where no test is determined solely by the speed or skill of the driver controlling the vehicle. It is not an Autotest. Multiple drivers can enter in the same vehicle. This year we have an even bigger field to play in. After the Gymkhana, there will be a nearby venue offering refreshments, which can be purchased as required.

1. Announcement:

The Grass Gymkhana will be held on Sunday 4 August 2019 and is organised by the CCHMSC Ltd. The event will be held at Craiglaw Farm Rumbling Bridge, Kinross KY13 0QQ. The event location, together with the refreshments venue, will be issued with the final instructions,

2. Jurisdiction:

The event will be held under the general rules of Motorsport UK as a Gymkhana and these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event. A Motorsport UK Gymkhana Permit has been applied for.

3. Eligibility:

The event is an open day for members of the Caledonian Classic and Historic Motor Sport Club, as well as all motorsport enthusiasts.

4. Vehicles:

The event is open to cars of any age. Standard road tyres only will be allowed. The use of off road. M + S, and 'knobbly' tyres is prohibited.

5. Entry List:

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and entry form.

The entry list closes on Thursday 1 August 2019.

6. Documentation:

Pre-event document inspection and signing on will take place from 11.00am at the above complex. The event will start at 12.00 noon.

7. Scrutineering

Entrants will be required to sign a declaration to say that they have the following

- A valid MOT certificate.
- A valid Road Fund Licence
- A minimum of Third Party Insurance for all persons who will drive the participating vehicles must be applicable for the duration of the event.

Cars must comply with the Motorsport UK regulations for the event.

8. Route, Navigation and Driving Behaviour:

The event will be on private land, predominantly grass fields. The tests and challenges will be supplied after inspection of documentation and signing on, prior to the start. It will take the form of a test and activity layout book.

Participants must always comply with the requirements of the Road Traffic Acts when driving to and from the event field, and drive in a responsible and considerate manner. Please remember that livestock and other users, cyclists, walkers and livestock, will be in the farm vicinity.

10. Entries:

The entry fee is £5 per driver. This includes a test and activity layout book, and a vehicle ID number. All entries must be made on the entry form. Payment can be made on the day at Signing On. Maximum number of entries is 30. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt. Email entries will be accepted. Either scan or photograph your entry form and email to the entry secretary. All entries must be on the official entry form.
