Scenic Observation Tour, Sunday 2nd August 2009

Supplementary Regulations

- 1) Lanarkshire Car Club Limited in association with Stirling & District Classic Car Club will promote a "Scenic Observation Tour" (Touring Assembly) – on Sunday 2nd August 2009.
- 2) The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FISA) these supplementary regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event.
- 3) A waiver of MSA permit number :- 53250 has been issued.
Route Authorisation has been applied for.
- 4) The event is open to all members of Stirling & District Classic Car Club, Lanarkshire Car Club, and members of the East of Scotland Association of Car Clubs, Association of West of Scotland Motor Sport Clubs and other members of the public may also participate (A21).
- 5) LCC entrants will be entitled to claim points in the LCC Club Championships.
- 6) The Event will Start at Dobbies Garden World, Drip Road, Craigforth, Stirling, FK9 4 UF.

Finishing at the Birds & Bees Restaurant, Easter Cornton Road, Causewayhead, Stirling.FK9 5PR.
Ordnance Survey map reference - 57/798957)

Signing on opens at :- 09:30 hrs.
Signing on closes at :- 10:30 hrs.

1st car leaves at :- 10:00 hrs.
(Cars will leave at 1minute intervals)

1st car expected to finish at :- 16:00 hrs approximately.
Finish control closes at :- 17:00 hrs.
Entrants arriving after this time will be deemed to be none finishers.

- 7) The event will be an 80-mile long observation run (Touring Assembly).
It will not be a speed event – more of a leisurely day out, where entrants will be provided with easy to follow instructions to guide them on their way along a variety of interesting roads at their own pace, with time for a lunch break at Vane Farm, Loch Leven Nature Reserve, near Kinross.
Maps are not required, but it may be use useful to have a road atlas to enable you to follow the route, or if you wish to follow it in more detail then Ordnance Survey 1:50,000 map numbers 65, 57 & 58 will be required.
As this is not a speed event there will be no prizes for the order of arriving at the finish control, however awards at the discretion of the organisers may be presented for the merit of the photographic competition and for the best presented vehicle.
To provide entrants with additional interest, they will be supplied at the start with a booklet containing a number of photographs, taken at a variety of locations along the route. Points will be awarded for correctly identifying and matching these to locations shown in the road book in the correct order.
Manned route checks may be set up to check correct compliance with the route instructions.

- 8) The event is open to all Classic and Modern cars. These must be taxed, insured for use on the public highway and in road worthy condition complete with MOT certificate if appropriate. Vehicles will be identified by their registration numbers and a number supplied by the organisers.
- 9) The entry fee per vehicle is £10. (Note - The cost of coffee/food is not included in the entry fee) The maximum number of entries is 50 the minimum is 10. Should the minimum number not be achieved, the organisers have the right to cancel the event. Entries open with the publication of these Supplementary Regulations and closes on 31 July 2009. Entries must be made on the Official Entry Form and must be accompanied by the appropriate fee.
