Rally of the Borders Clyde Valley 8 September 2024

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

The Rally of the Borders returns to the Clyde Valley on Sunday 8 September covering a new route over the border country of Scotland, with a visit arranged to a special location of interest on route. The pace of the event is ideal for those wishing to try a motor sport event for the first time. Starting at the New Lanark World Heritage Village, the tour will cover some 140 miles over scenic and interesting roads across the Scottish borders to finish around the Larkhall area for a high tea and presentations.

1. Announcement:

The Rally of the Borders Clyde Valley will be held on Sunday 8 September 2024 and is organised by the CCHMSC Ltd. The event will start the New Lanark World Heritage Village, Lanark, ML11 9DB and finish near Larkhall. The Start and finish locations will be issued with the final instructions.

2. Jurisdiction:

The event will be held under the general rules of the Motorsport UK as a Touring Assembly and these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event. Motorsport UK permit 137347 has been issued.

3. Eligibility:

The event is open to all members of MSUK Registered clubs, including the Caledonian Classic and Historic Motor Sport Club Ltd. Membership may be added to the entry form if required (£5 per person)

4. Vehicles:

The event is open to the following:

- a) Cars manufactured before 1980.
- b) Sporting and saloon cars of any age.
- d) Other cars permitted at the discretion of the organisers.

Cars constructed before 1980 will be given preference for entry.

5. Entry List:

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and entry form.

The entry list closes on Tuesday 3 September 2024.

Refunds for withdrawn entries will be at the discretion of the organisers.

6. Scrutineering

Pre-event document inspection and signing on will take place from 10.00am at the start location. The first car will depart at 10.45am and you will be given your start time in the final instructions.

Entrants will be required to sign a declaration to say that they have the following

- A valid MOT certificate.
- A valid Road Fund Licence
- A minimum of Third Party Insurance for all persons who will drive the participating vehicles must be applicable for the duration of the event.

Cars must comply with the Motorsport UK regulations for the event.

8. Route, Navigation and Driving Behaviour:

The route will be on public A and B class and unclassified roads all on sealed surfaces. The route instructions will be in the form of Tulip Diagrams, supplied after inspection of documentation and signing on, prior to the start.

Participants must always comply with the requirements of the Road Traffic Acts and drive in a responsible and considerate manner. Please remember other road users, cyclists, walkers and livestock.

10. Entries:

The entry fee is £50. This includes a rally plate, roadbook and high tea meal for two crew members at the finish. Refreshments at the start and on route are at the crew's own expense. All entries must be made on the entry form and accompanied by the appropriate fee. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt. Email entries will be accepted. (Scan or photograph your entry form and email to the entry secretary.) All entries must be on the official entry form. Posted entries should have the appropriate fee enclosed, or direct Bank Transfer. Email entries may pay by direct Bank Transfer.
