Tour of the Borders 5 October 2025

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

The Tour of the Borders is a tour starting at Elginhaugh Farm, 9 Gilmerton Road, Lasswade, Midlothian, EH18 1BD, (Opposite Dobbies Garden Centre Eskbank), finishing at The Stair Arms Hotel, A68, Pathhead EH37 5TX

The route will explore some new roads across the Scottish Borders, covering approximately 140 miles of interesting and scenic roads, with a good mix of straight and twisting sections. There are a number of suggested lunch stop and points of Interest on the route.

1. Announcement:

The Tour of the Borders tour will be held on Sunday 5 October 2025 and is organised by the CCHMSC Ltd. The event will start at Elginhaugh Farm, 9 Gilmerton Road, Lasswade, Midlothian, EH18 1BD (w3w///rift.zones.loyal), finishing at The Stair Arms Hotel, A68, Pathhead EH37 5TX (w3w///harnessed.message.masterful).

2. Jurisdiction:

The event will be held under the general rules of the Motorsport UK as a Touring Assembly and these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event. A Motorsport UK (MSUK) Touring Assembly Permit 204649 has been issued.

3. Eligibility:

The event is open to all members of the Caledonian Classic and Historic Motor Sport Club Ltd, Saltire Rally Club and members of other MSUK registered Motorsport Clubs. Membership of CCHMSC may be added to the entry form if required (£5 per person). Your MSUK club membership, must be valid for the date of this event.

4. Vehicles:

The event is open to the following:

- a) Cars manufactured before 1983.
- b) Sporting cars of any age.
- d) Other cars permitted at the discretion of the organisers.

5. Entry List:

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and entry form.
The entry list closes on Monday 29 September 2025.

6. Documentation:

Pre event signing on will take place from 9.00 am at the above start complex. The event will start at 10.00 am and you will be given your start time in the final instructions.

7. Scrutineering

Entrants will be required to sign a declaration to say that they have the following

- A valid MOT certificate.
- A valid Road Fund Licence
- A minimum of Third Party Insurance for all persons who will drive the participating vehicles must be applicable for the duration of the event.
- Crews recommended to carry Safety vests, Warning triangle, and oil spillage / splash mat.

Cars must comply with the Motorsport UK regulations for the event.

8. Route, Navigation and Driving Behaviour:

The route will be on public A and B class and unclassified roads and will all be on sealed surfaces. The route will be supplied after inspection of documentation and signing on, prior to the start. It will take the form of a Tulip Roadbook.

9. Participants must at all times comply with the requirements of the Road Traffic Acts and drive in a responsible and considerate manner. **Please remember other road users, cyclists, walkers and livestock. NOTE 20mph speed limits through some villages. Quiet roads are designated walking and cycling routes and have a 40 mph speed limit.**

10. Entries:

Entry price is £55 per car. This includes a Tulip Roadbook, rally plate, and a meal at the finish for two. All entries must be made on the entry form and accompanied by the appropriate membership fee if applicable.

Maximum number of entries is 40, minimum 15. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt.
