

The 2018 Autumn Run - Regulations Sunday 7th October

The Veterans of Scottish Motorsport Association (VSMA) propose to hold an Autumn Run on Sunday 7th October 2018. The event will start from Dobbies Garden Centre Perth, and finish at The Boathouse Restaurant Kilsyth. The route will cover approximately 70/80 miles. Food will be available at both start and finish locations.

1) Announcement:

The Autumn Run will be held on Sunday 7th October 2018 and is organised by the VSMA. The event will start from Dobbies Garden Centre Perth, and finish at The Boathouse Restaurant Kilsyth. Signing on will take place at Dobbies Garden Centre Perth.

Actual locations of the start & finish will be issued with the final instructions.

2) Eligibility:

The event is open firstly to all car enthusiasts who are members of The VSMA and thereafter members of the Caledonian Classic & Historic Motor Sport Club and members of RSAC Motorsport Ltd. Details of Club Membership may be inspected at documentation.

3) Vehicles:

The event is open to the following:

a) Sporting cars of any age.b) Other cars permitted at the discretion of the organisers.

4) Entry List:

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and entry form. The entry list closes on Monday 1st October 2018. Refunds for withdrawn entries will be at the discretion of the organisers.

5) Documentation:

Pre-event document inspection and signing on will take place from 10.30 at Dobbies Garden Centre. The event will start at 12.00 from Dobbies Garden Centre and as per the final Instructions.

6) Signing on:-

Entrants will be required to sign a declaration to say that they have the following where required by law:-

a) A Valid MOT Certificate

b) A Valid Road Fund Licence

c) Insurance - A minimum of Third Party Insurance for all persons who will drive the participating vehicles must be applicable for the duration of the event. Participants are responsible for ensuring that all drivers of vehicles entered in the event are fully covered by insurance during the event as required by the Road Traffic Acts and will be required to sign a declaration to that effect at the start. All crew members will also be required to sign a declaration at the start on the signing on sheet indemnifying the organisers from liability.

7) The Organisers:

... will not be responsible for damage to, or loss of, any car, its parts or accessories, or for any damage caused by any entrant or car, and any entrant by entering and driving, and a passenger by taking part, shall thereby waive any right of action at law against the Organisers for any damage sustained by him (her or them) in consequence of any act or omission on any part of the Organisers, or of the officials, representatives or agents with respect to these regulations or to the run or to any matter arising therefrom.

8) Route: Navigation and Driving Behaviour:-

The route will be on public A and B class and unclassified roads. The route is approximately 70/80 miles and all will be on sealed surfaces. The route is ALMOST entirely on smooth surfaces with only one or two sections with slight surface breaking. The route will be supplied after inspection of documentation and signing on, prior to the start. It will take the form of a Tulip Road book. Participants must at all times comply with the requirements of the Road Traffic Acts and drive in a responsible and considerate manner. Please remember other road users, cyclists, walkers and livestock.

Cars will start at one minute intervals - this in an attempt to avoid "bunching".

The organisers will use a minimal number of checks to ensure route compliance thus allowing the crew to enjoy the scenery and the event.

9) Entries:-

The entry fee for the event is $\pounds 15$ per car + food at the finish (if required) at the finish (see entry form). This will include a tulip road book. The maximum number of entries will be sixty (60).

Entries will be accepted in order of receipt. No email entries will be accepted. All entries must be on the official entry form, with the appropriate fee enclosed as a cheque or postal order. Cheques to be made payable to:-
